#### The Houthi Rebels and Yemen's Crisis – A Regional Powder Keg

Yemen's conflict is a brutal stain on global conscience. The Houthi rebels, who have shamelessly morphed from a local insurgency into a ruthless force of terror. are fueling a war that has brought Yemen to its knees. But make no mistake—this war is not just about the Houthis. It's about regional powers, namely Iran and Saudi Arabia, exploiting Yemen as a proxy to settle their own selfish, strategic scores. Iran's backing of the Houthis has armed them with sophisticated missile and drone technology, allowing them to strike Saudi civilian targets with impunity. Meanwhile, Saudi-led airstrikes have torn through Yemen, killing innocents and leaving a trail of destruction. Both sides are pouring fuel on the fire, with zero regard for the millions of Yemeni lives destroyed in the

process. This is not a conflict driven by ideology or justice—it's a savage power play by external actors, with Yemen's population caught in the crossfire. The international community's weak response delayed and is disgraceful. Diplomacy alone won't stop this bloodbath. It's time to hold the Houthis and their backers accountable for their war crimes. The world cannot afford to keep turning a blind eye while Yemen burns.
